

The Washington State 4-H Hall of Fame was established to recognize individuals and organizations that have had a significant impact upon the 4-H Youth Development Program and/or its members and leaders at any time since 4-H's beginning. Recipients will be honored in October, at the State 4-H Forum.

Eligibility: Anyone who has made a significant contribution to the development of 4-H or 4-H'ers in Washington State. Current 4-H faculty and staff are not eligible. Nominees may be living or deceased. Nominations will be accepted from any person or group in the 4-H family.

Nomination Information should include:

- Nominee's significant contribution to 4-H. *Be specific.*
- Breadth or depth of their contribution.
- Role played (4-H member, club leader, project leader, fair superintendent, Extension faculty/staff, advisory boards, Foundation trustee, other volunteer, etc.).
- Length of commitment.
- Impact on 4-H, either upon individuals or the entire program.

Other factors as appropriate:

- Impact on the community
- Major career accomplishments
- In what ways has the nominee been recognized, such as other awards, etc.
- Financial contribution to 4-H

**We request that photographs accompany the nomination form, but cannot be accepted later than September 15 if nominee is selected. Only photos on photo paper or in digital format and no less than 600 dpi will be accepted. If no photo is received, an appropriate 4-H image will be used in the banquet program and digital presentation.*
